COPPLE CROWN VILLAGE DISTRICT MEETING JULY 9, 2017

Meeting called to order at 1:20pm

Treasurer's report was read and approved Beginning balance: \$5,741.73 Ending balance: \$58,706.16

We received two bids to repave Saint Moritz Drive.

We tentatively agreed on Lakes Region Paving, pending a discussion on pricing for culverts and gravel, and based on availability.

Pat Grant shared information in regards to Municipal Lease-To-Own for Public Works Vehicles and Equipment as a means to get a truck for the winter. It was agreed that we will get more information about whether or not it could be used for road work as well. We will also need more information on payment time tables and restrictions if we are to use this for anything.

Kelly Bisson presented resident stickers. It was agreed to put it to an informal poll on Facebook to see if residents thought it was a good idea.

Steve Mraz and Corey Bisson agreed that they need to build a secure box for the new security camera system. It is temporarily located in the soon-to-be office, but the reception for the cameras isn't ideal.

Rick Pero re-shingled the roof on the entrance sign. It looks wonderful!

We discussed who has requested use of the lodge. We have paperwork for two of the three parties. Kelly Bisson suggested editing the request form to add some key points (such as fridge use, and that the community can still use the pool while an event is being held), and to post it on the town site so people can download and fill it out as needed.

Consumer Confidence Reports were mailed out with the water bills.

The Town has a new website that grants Kelly Bisson editing rights. This means more accurate information to come and timely updates to the minutes (as soon as she figures out the details of loading the files correctly).

Steve Mraz mentioned that Leona LeBlanc may be interested in becoming treasurer should the need arise. Steve also talked to Chris Gibbs, who is willing to be an interim commissioner until at least April.

We are going to make our last bond payment on the roads. Pat Grant will be making that payment very soon.

Corey Bisson submitted a design and content for a Pool Rules sign. Most rules were agreed on, with the exception of stronger wording to "Must Keep Gates Closed".

Because Chris Gibbs expressed interest in being a commissioner, Larrie Brown officially resigned.

All were in favor of skipping reading last month's minutes due to the heat in the room.
