Ice rink

 Discussion about setup, setup is finalized. The committee reviewed with the director Nichole the lessons learned about the issues with the location chosen for the rink. Playground area at the ball fields:

Dog Park Inquiry/Proposal-

 Initial discussion about having an area at the ball fields for a dog park for residents. Location discussed, possible location could be far end of bottom parking lot in back area. Reviewed informative documentation provided by Insurer, Primax. NH Public Risk Management exchange.
