26 27	<b>Budget Review</b> The Board reviewed the Bond Schedule. It was noted that the final one will be paid off in 2024.
28	Account 4583 – Town Historian
29 30 31 32	Ms. Orlowicz explained the details of the budget request; she stated the request for patriotic supplies is for purchasing flags. She stated she needs to purchase organizing materials such as shelving and binders for genealogical records. She stated the archival costs are for items being stored in the vault.
33 34	MOTION: To approve the FY 2024 Budget for Account 4583 Town Historian in the amount of \$630. Motion by Chair Swenson. Second by Selectman DeCoff. Motion passed 3-0-0.
35	Account 4589 – Boodey Farmstead Portion
36 37	The Board reviewed the proposed budget. Ms. Orlowicz explained the projects being planned for next year.

- 42 The Board reviewed the proposed budget. Representatives from the New Durham Water Quality
- 43 Committee gave an overview of what the committee does which is mainly water quality testing.
- It was noted there are 6 swimmable ponds in New Durham which are monitored on a monthly
- 45 basis from May to September. The tests are done through UNH and the costs are going to be
- 46 increasing from \$12 to \$14 per test. There was an additional request for fuel and mileage
- reimbursements to the committee volunteers who conduct the testing. The Board agreed to
- 48 postpone approving the budget so more research can be done on funding options as the FY24
- 49 budget request includes a signicant increase for a proposed study (>\$8,000).

## 50 Account 4140 – Elections and Registrations

51 The Board reviewed the proposed budget. It was noted there are additional elections which are

- reflected in the increase in the budget. With the new voting machines there is a set fee so the number of elections will not change those costs.
