Chief's Corner:



Hope you all had a great summer, now fall is upon us with cooler weather ahead and the need for heating equipment is inevitable. We are here to help you reduce the risks of a house fire. We will have a series of educational tips and changes you can make in your homes to reduce the risk of a fire and help keep you and your loved ones safe this winter.

This week we will give these suggestions to make sure you are ready for the heating season ahead.

Fireplaces and Woodstoves

- Inspect and clean woodstove pipes and chimneys annually and check monthly for damage or obstructions.
- Use a fireplace screen heavy enough to stop rolling logs and big enough to cover the entire opening of the fireplace to catch flying sparks.
- Make sure the fire is completely out before leaving the house or going to bed.

Portable Space Heaters

- Keep combustible objects at least three feet away from portable heating devices.
- Only buy heaters evaluated by a nationally recognized laboratory, such as Underwriters Laboratories (UL).
- Check to make sure the portable heater has a thermostat control mechanism and will switch off automatically if the heater falls over.

More Fire Safety Tips

- · Make digital copies of valuable documents and records like birth certificates.
- · Sleep with your bedroom doors closed.
- Keep a fire extinguisher in your kitchen. Contact your local fire department for assistance on proper use and maintenance.
- Consider installing an automatic fire sprinkler system in your residence.

- No trees, branches, sticks, wood, stumps, plastic or paper bags, no rocks and no ashes accepted. Must be removed from all bags.
